### **The Book of 2 Kings – General**

- The Book of Kings-B (מלכים ב) *Meleckim Bet*
- Author: Unknown
  - Tradition points to Jeremiah
- Date:
  - Begins with deterioration of the two kingdoms
  - Ends with the deportation of the Southern Kingdom
- Covers: 853 – 586 BC

## Structure of Kings\*

- 1 Kings 1 -11\*\* – Beginning of Davidic kingdom
- 1 Kings 12-16 – Beginning of northern kingdom
- 1 Kings 17-2 Kings 1 – Beginning of Ahab's kingdom
- 2 Kings 2-8 – The prophet Elisha
- 2 Kings 9-13 – End of Ahab's kingdom
- 2 Kings 14-17 – End of northern kingdom
- 2 Kings 18-25 – End of Davidic kingdom

\*\* 1 Kings 1-2 actually ends section of 2 Samuel

## The Book of 2 Kings – Structure

- 1-17: Deterioration of Israel and Judah
  - Deterioration (1-16)
  - Israel's Deportation (17)
- 18-25: Demise of Judah
  - Demise (18-24)
  - Judah's Deportation (25)

  - Asa (14-16)
  - Jehoshaphat (17-20)

  - Uzziah/Azariah (26)
  - Jotham (27)
  - Ahaz (28)
  - Hezekiah (29-32)
  - Manasseh (33)
  - Josiah (35)
  - Jehoahaz (36)
  - Jehoiakim (36)
  - Jehoiachin (36)
  - Zedekiah (36)

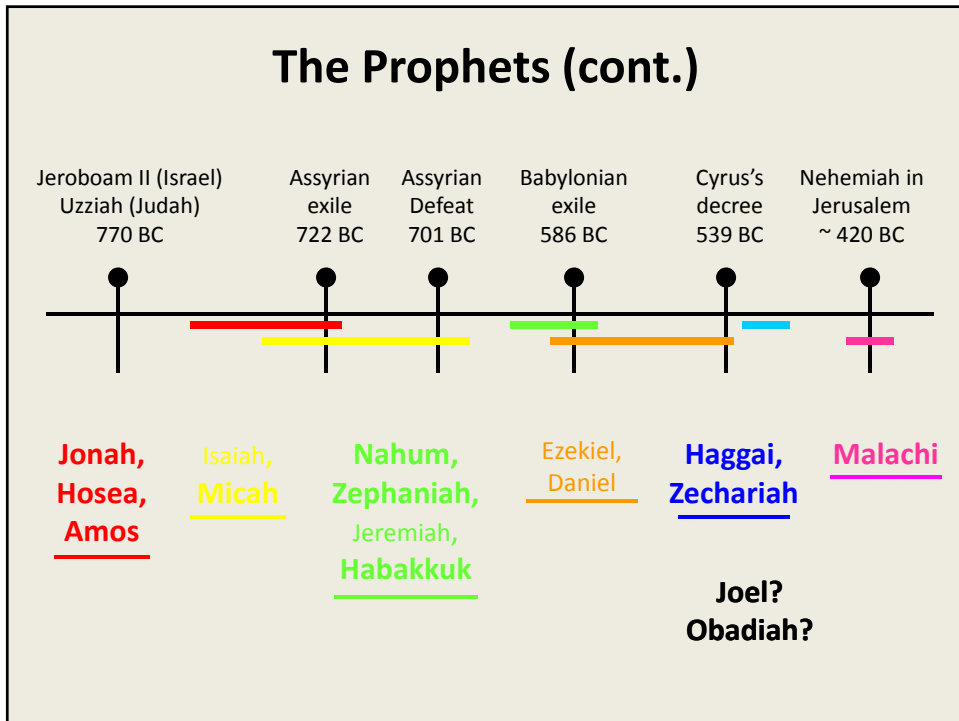

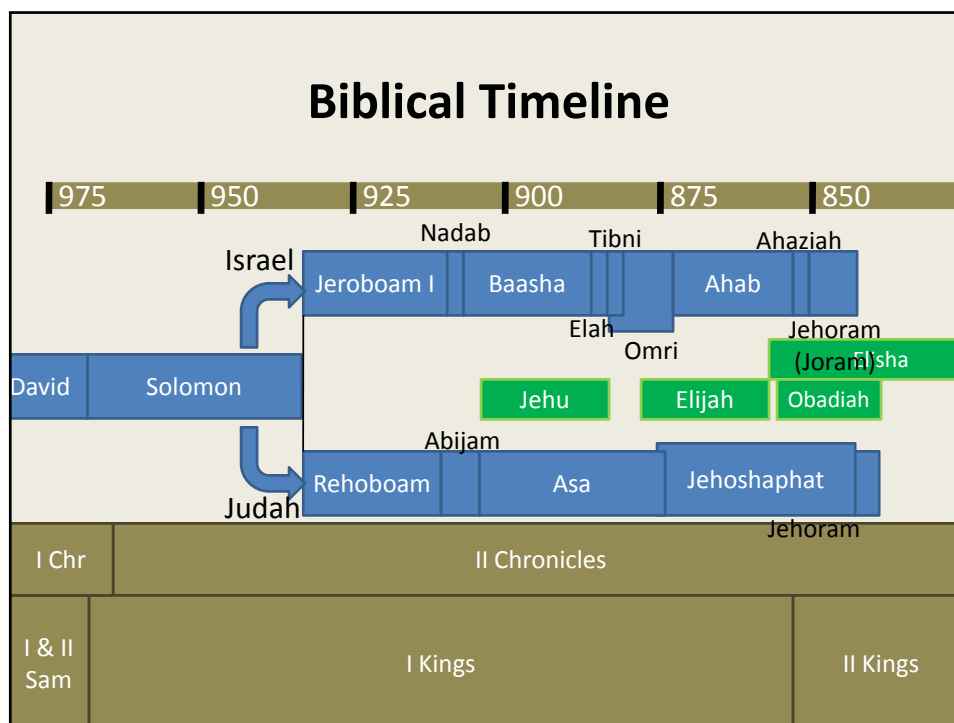

- “Worshiper of Jehovah”
- Author: Obadiah
- Date:
  - Southern Kingdom
  - Jehoram, Ahaziah, Athalia, Joash
- Covers: 840-830
- Theme: Retribution

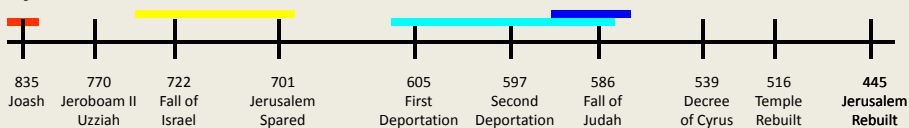
- Edom's Pride (1-9)
- Edom's Violence (10-14)
- Edom's Demise (15-21)

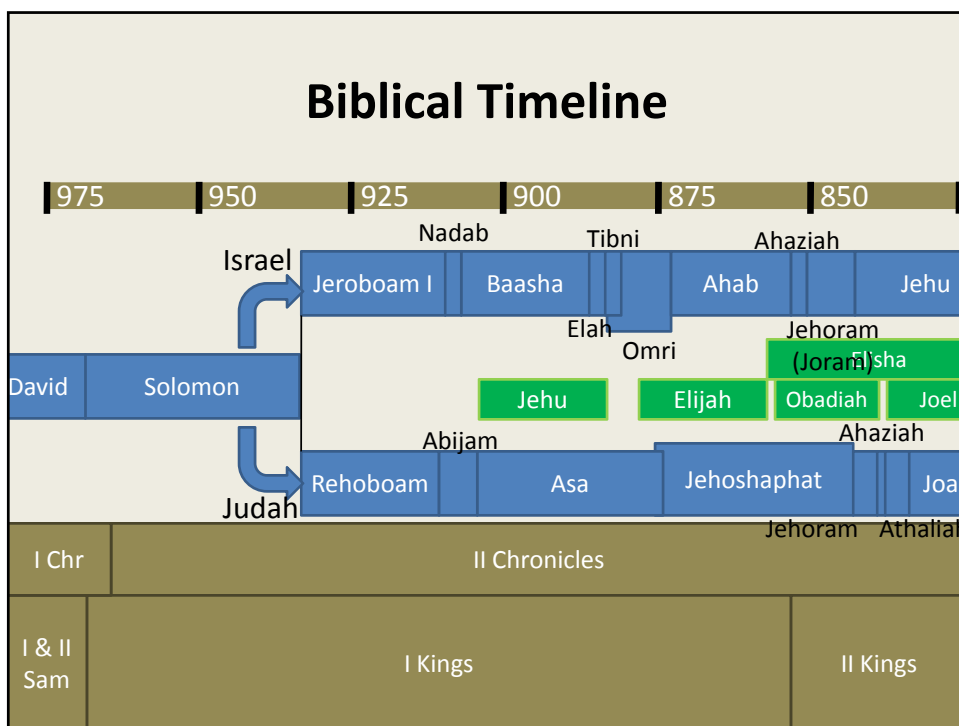

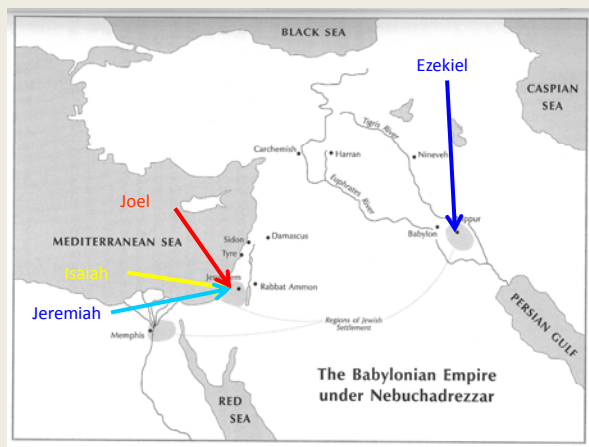
## The Book of Joel – General

- The Book of Joel (יִזְעָל) *Joel*
- “Jehovah is God”
- Author: Joel
- Date:
  - Southern Kingdom
  - Joash
- Covers: 830-820
- Theme: Visitation

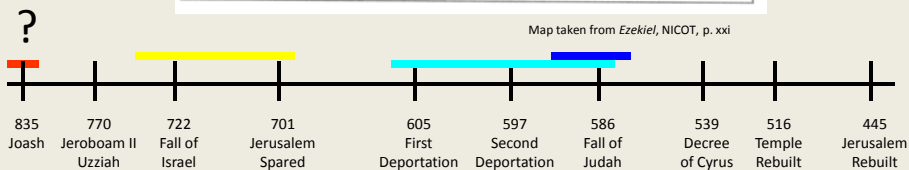
## The Book of Joel – Structure

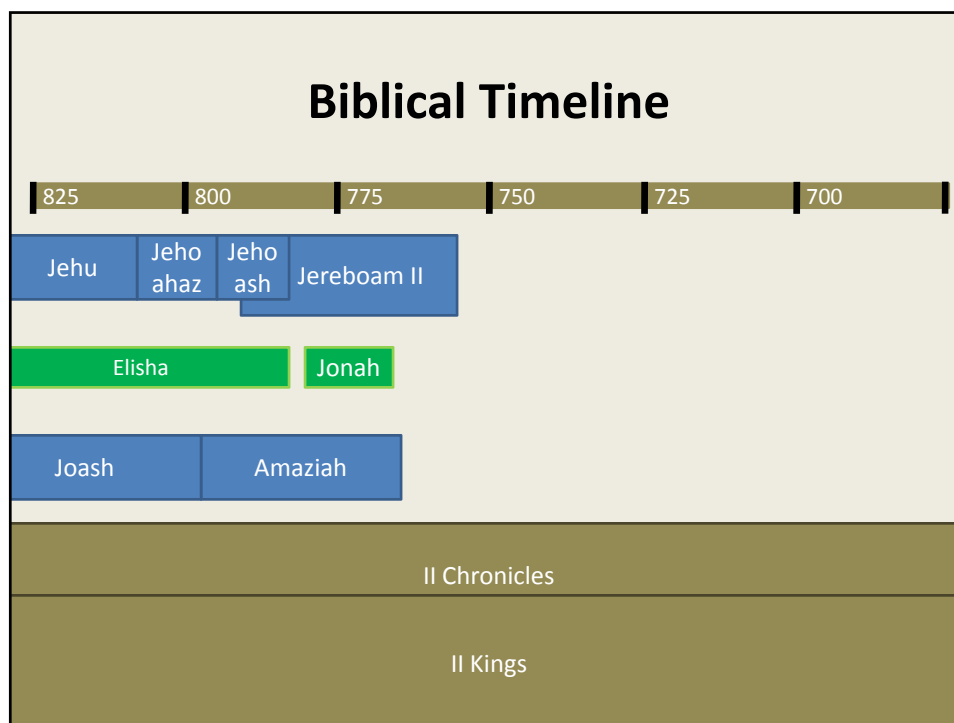
- Dusk: Land razed by locusts (1:1-14)
  - Worse coming! Destruction (1:15-20)
    - Midnight: Land destroyed by army (2:1-11)
      - **Call to Repentance (2:12-17)**
- Dawn: Land restored by Yahweh (2:18-27)
  - Better coming! Deliverance (2:28-31)
    - Noon: Land delivered by Yahweh (3:1-21)

## The Book of Jonah – General

- The Book of Jonah (יֵאוֹנָתַן) *Yonah*
- “Dove”
- Author: Jonah
- Date:
  - Northern Kingdom
  - Jeroboam II
- Covers: 780-760
- Theme: Commission

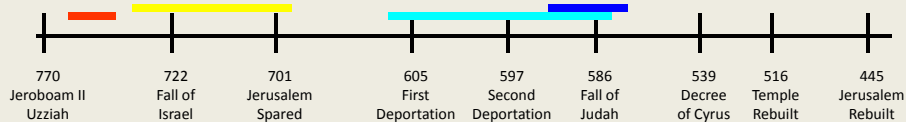
## The Book of Jonah – Structure

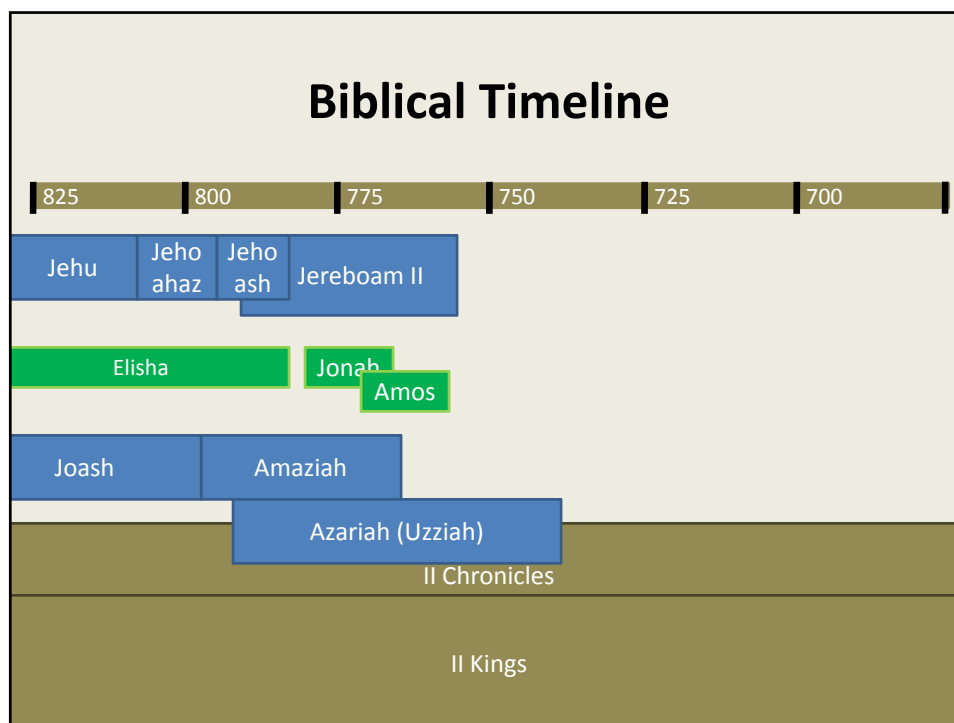
- Jonah’s commissioning and flight (1:1–3)
  - Jonah and the pagan sailors (1:4–16)
    - Jonah’s grateful prayer (1:17–2:10)
- Jonah’s recommissioning and compliance (3:1–3a)
  - Jonah and the pagan Ninevites (3:3b–10)
    - Jonah’s angry prayer (4:1–4)
- Jonah’s lesson about compassion (4:5–11)

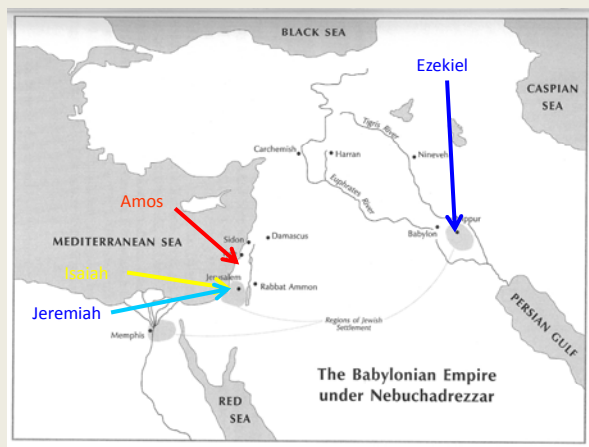
## The Book of Amos – General

- The Book of Amos (עֲמוֹס) *Amos*
- “Burden Bearer”
- Author: Amos
- Date:
  - Northern Kingdom
  - Jeroboam II
- Covers: 755-750
- Theme: Threatened

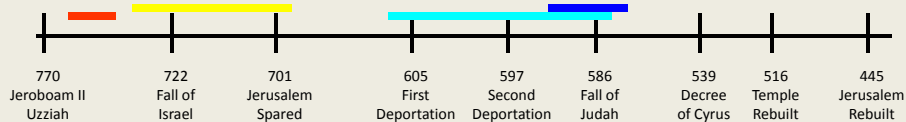
## The Book of Amos – Structure

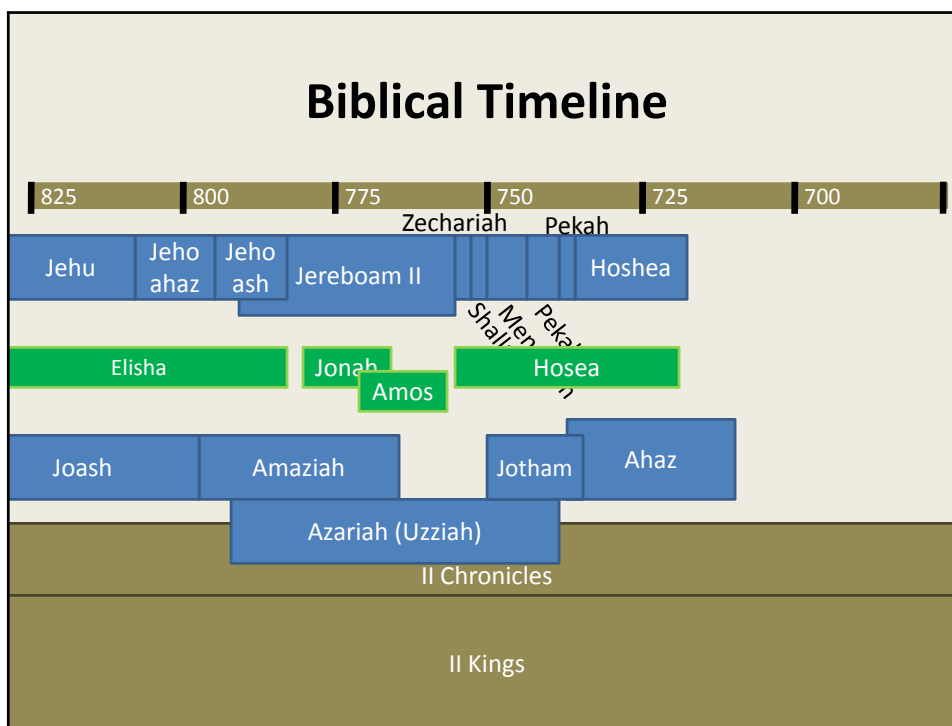
- Judgment upon Israel and Neighbors (1-2)
  - Destruction of Israel, especially Bethel (3)
    - Rich Israelite Women, Yahweh’s Coming Judgment (4)
      - **Call to Repentance (5:1-17)**
    - Rich Israelite Men, Yahweh’s Coming Judgment (5:18-6:14)
  - Destruction of Israel, especially Bethel (7:1-8:3)
- Judgment upon Israel, but Future Restoration (8:4-9:15)

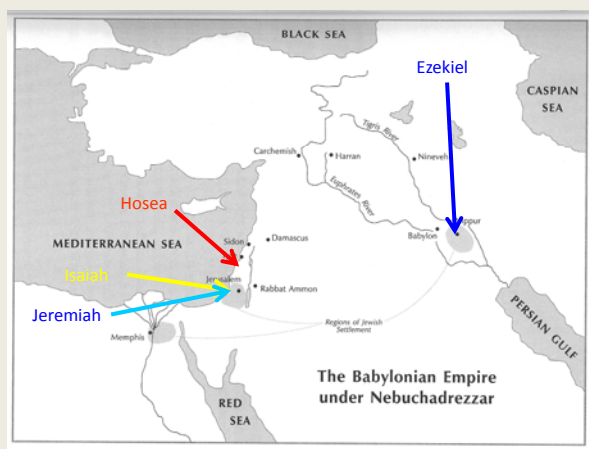
## The Book of Hosea – General

- The Book of Hosea (הוֹשֵׁעַ) *Hoshea*
- “Salvation”
- Author: Hosea
- Date:
  - Northern Kingdom
  - Jeroboam II, Zechariah, Shallum, Menahem, Pekahiah, Pekah, Hoshea
- Covers: 760-710
- Theme: Estrangement

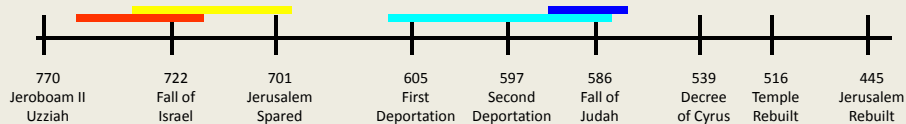
## The Book of Hosea – Structure

- Wayward Wife, Loving Husband (1-3)
  - Narrative: Gomer wayward (1)
  - Poetry: Israel wayward but brought home (2)
  - Narrative: Gomer brought home (3)
- Wayward Israel, Loving Yahweh (4-10)
- Wayward Son, Loving Father (11-14)

## Threads Woven Throughout the Bible Even the OT Presupposes the OT

### Exodus 20

- 1) ... no other gods before Me (v. 3)
- 2) ... not make for yourself an idol (v. 4)
- 3) ... not take the name of the LORD your God in vain (v. 7)
- 4) Remember the sabbath day (v. 8)
- 5) Honor your father and mother (v. 12)
- 6) You shall not murder (v. 13)
- 7) You shall not commit adultery (v. 14)
- 8) You shall not steal (v. 15)
- 9) You shall not bear false witness (v. 16)
- 10) You shall not covet ... (v. 17)

### Hosea 4:1-2

Listen to the word of the LORD, O sons of Israel, for the LORD has a case against the inhabitants of the land, because there is no faithfulness or kindness or knowledge of God in the land.

There is swearing, deception, murder, stealing, and adultery.

They employ violence, so that bloodshed follows bloodshed
